The trip presented an incredible opportunity for students to experience sites of historical, spiritual and cultural significance and reflect upon how these have impacted society and civilisations over thousands of years.




### #responsibility

### Next steps for our dance students




Our A level Dance students visited Northern School of Contemporary Dance in Leeds recently, to explore opportunities for further study.
